CALL FOR PAPERS

I. PRESENTATION

Projectiology is the science dedicated to the study of consciousness projections outside the human body and their effects, including projections of bioenergies. The organizing team of the VII CIPRO invites all consciousness researchers to this scientific event, where personal experiences related to this field will be presented and discussed.

II. INVITATION

You are invited to participate in the VII CIPRO – International Congress of Projectiology – an event dedicated to promoting and disseminating new ideas and leading-edge relative truths on the subject, with the aim of guiding, consolidating, spreading, and expanding the science of conscious projection.

III. OBJECTIVES OF THE EVENT

1. Promote the integration and update of researchers and the general public regarding advances in the field of Projectiology.
2. Foster the development of new consensuses on methods and effects of projectability through open debate.
3. Present self-research conducted through conscious projection, with a focus on scientific rigor and critical thinking.
4. Disseminate the importance of lucid projectability as a tool for accelerating personal evolution.
5. Promote the use of the Consciential Paradigm in consciousness research.

IV. EVENT THEMES

Researchers are invited to submit papers based on their personal experimentation, addressing the following thematic lines (though not limited to them):

1. Original contributions to the expansion of the *Projectiology Treatise*.
2. Experimental designs in projectiological research.
3. Near-death experiences (NDEs).
4. Lucidity scale of the projected *conscin* (intraphysical consciousness).
5. Laboratory experiments related to conscious projection.
6. Simultaneous phenomena with conscious projection.
7. Ambivalent projective phenomena: objective and/or subjective.
8. Projectiological research methodology.
9. Parallels between conscious projection and other phenomena.
10. Conscious projection and interconsciousness assistance.
11. Conscious projection and bioenergies.
12. Conscious projection and self-research.
13. Relationship between conscious projection and consciousness evolution.

V. PAPER SUBMISSION

Style, Length, and Structure

Submit the formatted article using **letter-size paper**, Times New Roman font size 12, 1.5 line spacing, justified alignment, with 2.5 cm top and bottom margins and 3.0cm left and right margins. Files should be submitted in Word or similar text editor format. The article **must contain** a maximum of **4,000 words** and include,

in the following order:

1. **Title and name(s) of the author(s)** (limited to 5 authors per article).
2. **Abstract / Resúmen / Resumo** (in English, Spanish, and Portuguese), up to 200 words, including: introduction, objectives, methods, results, and conclusions.
3. **Keywords:** 3 to 6 keywords (in alphabetical order) for indexing.
4. **Introduction:** presenting the research context, objectives, methodology used, and the structure of the article's sections.
5. **Main Content:** divided into numbered sections containing discussion, methods, techniques, results, and arguments.
6. **Conclusion or Final Remarks:** summarizing and relating directly to the objectives stated in the introduction.
7. **References:** formatted according to ABNT standards (see items 3, 4, and 5 below).
8. **Author(s) short bio:** including academic background; professional activity; Consciencentric Institution (CI) and volunteer time; email address; and phone number.

References

1. The text must give credit to the original author(s) or the researcher(s) who inspired the ideas.
2. In-text citations should follow the style: "Author (year; page)" or "(AUTHOR, year; page)".
3. All in-text references must be included in the bibliography under the section titled **REFERENCES**.
4. The bibliography should be listed in alphabetical order and numbered sequentially, in accordance with ABNT standards.
5. Other sources used in the preparation of the article should be listed in a separate section titled **CONSULTED BIBLIOGRAPHY**.

VI. DEADLINES

Submission of papers: **until October 5th, 2025**.

Notification of accepted papers: **January 10th, 2026**.

VII. COPYRIGHT

Approved papers will have their copyright assigned to the IIPC Headquarters for publication in the event proceedings in the **Homo Projector** journal. This assignment will be formalized through the submission of a signed document with notarized signature.

VIII. EVALUATION

Papers will be evaluated through a double-blind review system by a technical team of reviewers with expertise in the event's thematic areas, appointed by the congress coordination. Evaluation criteria will include scientific rigor, originality, technical quality, relevance to consciousness studies, and the contribution to the advancement of Conscientiology, particularly in the field of Projectiology.
