Types of contributions accepted:

1. Original articles (articles containing experimental research, biographies, reviews, among others).

2. Critique papers (with analyses of scientific events, published texts, films or documentaries and websites related to consciential themes).

3. Interviews (with personalities of recognized competence who contribute in a theoretical and practical (theorice) and exemplary manner to studies of suggested themes).

4. Case reports (with scientific details of personal experiences, perceptions and paraperceptions, preferably covering parapsychic phenomena, such as out-of-body experiences, retro and precognitions, among others).

Format:

Manuscripts must be written in a compatible rich text format (.rtf) or Word for Windows (.doc), in English, Times New Roman, font 12, spacing 1.5, margins of 2 cm, maximum 4,500 words, containing:

Title (brief phrase describing the contents of the paper).

Name / surname of author(s), e-mail addresses.

Abstract (maximum 150 words).

Keywords (3 to 6).

Introduction (relevant literature, objectives, approaches and methodologies).

Development/findings (interpretation of findings considering past studies on the topic).

Conclusive arguments (main conclusions).

References: according to the American Psychological Association (APA) Style.

Submissions: as an e-mail attachment to the Editorial Committee at <u>ijc.editorial@gmail.com</u> or through the IJC website: <u>www.ijc.isicons.org</u> (you need to register and login to make a submission).

Submission of a manuscript implies that the work described has not been published before.

Deadline: March 2, 2025

The criteria for acceptance of contributions include alignment with the consciential paradigm, scientificity, confor (content and form), and verponogenic and claritaskal potential.
